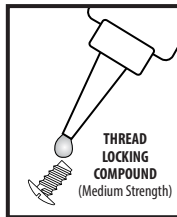

**IMPORTANT CONSUMER
AND WARRANTY INFORMATION
ON BACK OF PACKAGE**

1. Before starting to work, **MAKE SURE THE FIREARM IS UNLOADED.** Remove existing grips.

2. Place new grips into position on firearm. Hogue recommends the use of medium strength thread locking compound with all semi-automatic pistols, particularly on frames with aluminum threads. Add a drop to the threaded end of the screw.



3. Insert grip screw into screw hole and tighten, being careful not to smear compound onto grip face. **USE CAUTION WHILE TORQUING SCREWS, PARTICULARLY ON FRAMES WITH ALUMINUM THREADS.**

IMPORTANT!

Check all functions of your firearm after grips are installed. **Test-fire your firearm.** This is especially important if weapon is to be used for law enforcement duty.

4. G10 GRIPS ONLY: If your G10 grip's texture is more aggressive than desired, a 320 grit sandpaper can be used to achieve a smoother feel. Re-oil grip upon completion.

5. Care and Cleaning: Use a toothbrush to clean the grip's texture then mineral oil (unscented baby oil) to return the luster to your G10 grip. For aluminum grips, gently wipe with window cleaner to clean.

A FEW WORDS ABOUT FIT

Firearm frame dimensions vary from firearm to firearm. No grip is shipped unless it fits and functions on **our** firearms properly.

It is imperative to make sure that every firearm functions properly with after-market grips installed. Although the grip functions properly on our firearms, it is the user's responsibility to check all functions of a firearm after new grips are installed. This is especially important if the weapon is to be used for law enforcement duty. If you do not feel competent to check the proper function yourself, we suggest visiting your gunsmith to check this for you.

It is important to test-fire a firearm fitted with new grips before using it in the field.
